Treasurer's Report

- -Shawn Lewis passed around the current balance sheet.
- -We'll have about \$10,000 after all the bills are paid.
- -Our current "Total Liabilities and Fund Balance" is \$14,876.94.

Administrative Services

- -Cliff Moore offered a motion to extend Olivia's current contract with the HRT.
- -The motion was seconded and passed, nobody voted against this motion.
- -We will need to talk to Ivan about our options for the hosting of the Latino Youth Summit databases.

Membership Coordinator - Report

- -Annual membership renewal dues should are due in January.
- -\$25 for personal, \$100 corporate, \$500 lifetime.

Youth Education Committee - Cliff Moore

- -First a big thank you to everyone who came to and helped make this event happen.
- -We had about 60 volunteers this year.
- -We got more students than expected, about 450.
- -We also had more community and academic tables than ever this year.
- -Planning started for this event back in March of 2007.
- -The committee still has a bunch of thank you's to send out, letters with certificates and signed posters.
- -Signed posters will be framed and presented to sponsors.
- -The keynote speaker set the tone and really captured the imagination of the audience this year.
- --He continually wove the theme of the conference into his presentation.
- -For next year the committee is looking into getting Consuelo.
- -Lilia and Cliff do handwritten thank-you's for all volunteers.
- -Kathy, Jose and Olivia are working together on the other thank you's.
- -Between 450 to 500 students attended this year.
- -Next year the event will be on October 29th at South Puget Sound Community College.
- -Government agencies, private businesses, school districts, insurance agencies, and community groups support this summit.
- -Colleges involved have access to student registration lists.
- -There is a debriefing meeting on December 4th from 1 to 3 at WSU Extension in Thurston County and all interested parties may attend.
- -The summit is not only for Latino students, but it is also an educational opportunity for the community at large.

Guest Speaker – Jose Garcia-Pabón

- -Jose is new (4 months) at the WSU Extension Office in Tri-Cities, WA
- -He is the Latino Community Development Specialist and this is a new position for WSU.
- -He is currently in the process of learning the issues and challenges for the Latino community in Washington state and simultaneously designing his new job.
- -Jose has come to Washington from Missouri.
- -His position is statewide and he will be forming partnerships all over the state.
- -There are a large number of Latinos/Hispanics in the tri-cities.
- -Franklin County has the highest percentage of Latinos in the state.
- -The Latino Youth Summit could be a great model to bring back to the tri-cities.
- -Jose would like to create leadership trainings for Latino youth.
- -He would like to establish a Labor, Immigration and Sustainability Center.

- -- This would be a place where researchers, students, and practitioners come together, it would be a clearinghouse for the state.
- -He would also like to work on cultural competency trainings for WSU extension and beyond.
- -Alejandro spoke about not only recruitment but retention and reasons for apathy in the Latino community.
- -He talked about the importance of getting information into the hands of Latinos.
- --Alejandro gave the example of being able to pay off tickets with community service. This is a useful information that is not getting out to many members of the Latino community who could this. You get "paid" \$10 an hour towards your ticket for community service at places like SafePlace and the Timberland Regional Library.

Jose talked about developing a model for the Latino Youth Summit for our organization that we can share with other communities.

- -Jose would like us to start thinking about what a parent conference would look like.
- --How will we do it? Will it move around the counties, will it be done in each county, etc.?
- -The United Way is currently very focused on the Thrive By Five campaign.
- -- This Parent conference would be a good way to bring a new program that is also very connected to what the United Way already does.
- -There is a network we can tap into, we can partner with schools and community organizations.
- -Items to consider: childcare, transportation, etc.?
- -Jose is going to look into getting an official HRT computer for Olivia to work with.
